Great grandparents are Thelma Williams, Grant Williams, Edna Parker and Charlie Parker.



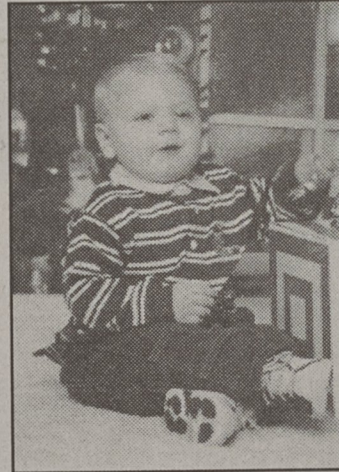
Lil Paul notes first birthday
