teaching/learning situatio for our students and staff. Briefly, let's take a look at the composition of a school calendar. A school calendar
must be composed of 220 must be composed of 220
days. The days are to be distributed as follows: -A minimum one 180 instructional days for students and a minimum of
1,000 hours of instruction covering at least nine calendar months. Instructional

May. These make-up days are normally scheduled on discretionary teacher workdays in February and March as well as annual vacation leave days scheduled at Easter break in march or
April. This ensures the max imum instructional opportunities for student success on their end-of-grade or end-of
course test. course test.
