Whetstine given flag case for WWII medals

Clyde Whetstine was honored at a reception May 24 to recognize his World War II service in the Pacific Theater.

The reception was hosted by his niece, Diane Whetstine.

American Legion Post 155 Commander Claude Pearson presented Whetstine with a flag case medal display exhibiting his various medals. From 1942 through the end of the war in 1945, Whetstine served with the 5th Army Air Force, 380th Bomb Group, 531st Squadron.

Affectionately known as The Flying Circus, the 380th BG was the B-24 Liberator bomber group group credited with turning back the Japanese invasion of Australia. After two years of operating from secret bases



380th moved into the Philippines in February 1945. There, they joined the rest of the 5th Air Force in attacks on Formosa, Indo China, Japanese areas of the Philippines, and on China itself. In June 1945, the group moved to Okinawa to begin the attack on Japan proper. The Flying Circus, in their B-24's, made the longest bombing missions of WWII, to the oil refineries of Balikpapan, Borneo (200 miles further than the Ploesti mission in Europe) and to those at Surabaja, Java (as long as Ploesti).


