Hospice project receives \$250,000 Reynolds grant

Hospice of Cleveland County has been awarded a \$250,000 grant from the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust of Winston-Salem

The funds will be used to help finance the expansion of the Wendover facility, according to Patti Ellis McMurry, director of sup-

portive services

The 8100 square foot expansion, budgeted at about \$1.45 million, includes two inpatient rooms and six residential rooms, bringing the total bed count to 14. Al eight of the new rooms will feature a full private bath and a private patio. The project also includes a new living room, dining room, family kitchen, and family room as well as a new main entrance. The existing entrance and living room will be converted into a chapel.

"Our organization has served over 700 patients at Wendover since the first patient was admitted in June 1996," McMurry said. "During the last two years alone, because no

beds were available, over 170 patients were denied admission to Wendover during their final days. Wendover is currently too small to meet the needs of our growing number of patients in Cleveland County. The grant from Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust will give us additional resource to help with our expansion project."

Hospice of Cleveland county was incorporated in 1984, served its first patient in October 1985, and has since served over 3,200 patients in Cleveland and surrounding counties. Dr. Robert Gossett is chairman of

the board of directors.

The Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust was created in 1947 by the will of Mrs. William N. Reynolds of Winston Salem. Three-fourths of the Trust's grants are designated for use for health-related programs and services across North Carolina and one-fourth for the poor and needy of Winston Salem and Forsyth County.
