The week concluded on Thursday night with each player receiving a Cooperstown Dreams Park ring and induction into the Youth Baseball Hall of Fame.

Kings Mountain Family YMCA is having sign-ups for recreational soccer, baseball and softball through Friday, August 15.


Anyone interested should stop by the YMCA for information.


