Meanwhile, the South Point defense was all over Kings Mountain's Pro-I attack. The Mountaineers managed only two first downs in the first half (and three for the game).

The Mountaineers fumbled the second half kickoff at their own 22 yard line, and following a holding penalty the Raiders marched 32 yards in just three plays with Williams keeping the ball around left end on an option play for a 35-0 lead.

After that the Raiders turned the game over to their second unit which scored touchdowns on a 68-yard run by Josh Robinson and a 37-yard keeper by reserve quarterback Corey Brown.

For the game the Raiders ran up 522 yards of total offense (345 on the ground and 177 in the air) to just 63 for the Mounties (all on the ground).

Even though the Raiders are one of the most talented teams in North Carolina and were expected to win heavily, Farquharson said he wasn't pleased with his team's performance.

"We could have played better," he said. "I think we came out flat. For whatever reason I don't think we got after it as well as we could have.

"We didn't come out to do anything fancy," he added. "We worked on a good package as far as run and play action but we just didn't execute. We didn't have the same

"Their fullback (Brian Phillips, 5-10, 215 pounds) and their quarterback (Ben Riddle, 6-1, 175 pounds) do a good job," Farquharson noted. "Again it's going to mean coming in and taking care of those option responsibilities of the quarterback and fullback."

The Jaguars return their top rushers from a year ago, J.R. Armstrong and Phillips. Each gained over 800 yards rushing. Jay Carroll was a top reserve last year and has moved into the starting wingback slot.

Defensively, the Jaguars return three starting linebackers (Nick Riddle, O.J. Hatten and Justin Mack) but other defensive positions are

He's just a super kid and it's going to be hard to fill his shoes.'

Otherwise, Farquharson said, the Mountaineers are in good shape physically and should be ready to play.
