Applications for fuel assistance

Applications for fuel assistance will be accepted by the **Cleveland** County Department of Social Services November 3-14 (with the exception of Veteran's Day on November 11).

The Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) is a federally-funded program that provides a onetime cash payment to help eligible families supplement their heating bills. Under this plant, payments will be targeted toward all Food Assistance households active in the Food Stamp Information System as of September 30. These households will receive an automatic payment for heating costs if they meet all LIEAP

guidelines. Other Food Assistance households that are ineligible for an automatic payment will receive a letter advising them to go to the **Cleveland County** Department of Social Services to apply during the application period.

Last year 2,905 households were assisted with an average payment of \$76.44. The amounts of the checks are unknown until all applications are taken. Checks are

mailed out in February. In order to be eligible, families must meet an income test, be responsible for the household's heating bill, be a U.S. citizen and household's income cannot exceed \$2,200. The monthly income limit for a family of four is \$1,687. For more information, call
