KM 47% proficient on state writing test

Kings Mountain students scored an average of 47 percent proficient on state writing tests administered last year, however, officials say scores are low region wide.

"We're not happy with where we are. We are no worse off than other people," Assistant Superintendent John Goforth told the Kings Mountain District School's board during their Monday night meeting.

KMDS fourth graders scored 46 percent proficient; seventh graders 52 percent, and sophomores, 44 percent.

Goforth told the board that the state has not offered adequate teacher training in how to prepare students for the test.

The test was a pilot; therefore schools are not held accountable for results. Prior to that test, state officials suspended the test for two vears to revise it.

KMDS is now working with Cleveland County and Shelby City schools on teacher instruction, Goforth said

eral audit. Official results are expected next month.

"I'm sure things will go well with their evaluation," said board member Mike Smith.
