KM Hospital OBITUARIES reviews year at meeting

Cleveland HealthCare Systems board of directors met Friday for a year end review.

Reginna Gregg updated board members on Kings Mountain Hospital. She told them the hospital had maintained its own identity in the midst of partnering with Cleveland Regional Medical Center.

CCHS is using KMH's paid time off program and computer system as a model for its other facilities.

The radiology department has grown since it began offering MRI screens one day a week on Sundays.

'That has been tremendous," Gregg said.

The hospital experienced a nursing shortage at the beginning of the year but is now down to one vacancy, Gregg said.

The pain clinic and physical therapy department have experienced high growth, according to Gregg.

KMH employees are "on fire" with the United Way campaign, she said. The hospital has also hired its first full time educator.

"It's been a good year. We

have waited a long time to go and grow." Gregg said.

On the down side, Piedmont Urology moved its practice, however, a group from CRMC is now serving Kings Mountain.

"They are delightful to work with," Gregg said. Alex Bell updated the board on construction. KMH expects the state Department of Facility Services to approve its \$8 million expansion by mid to late January. According to Bell, the 33,000 square foot expansion will make a 'huge statement and impact in Kings Mountain."

The hospital expects to hear by mid-February if it is awarded a certificate of need by the state to install a permanent MRI machine. Bell called the hospital's application "strong." The project would cost between \$3 and \$3.5 million.

The next building project will be an expanded physical therapy and rehabilitation program. That project will not exceed \$450,000, according to Bell.

The hospital also hopes to replace its current generators, one is 45 years old and the other dates back to the 1980s
