Locks of Love

Relay for Life meeting sees 11-year-old donate hair for wig for cancer patients

An eleven-year-old girl and her hairdresser teamed up to help people with cancer. The girl's friend offered moral support and her mom helped with the scissors.

Cherryville hairdresser Tina Leatherman donated her time to cut five inches from Samantha Haskett's long, red hair. The cut took place during the Monday night Relay for Life team captain's meeting at the Patrick Senior Center.

Samantha will donate her hair to the Florida based Locks of Love. The organization makes wigs for people who have lost their hair due to chemotherapy treatments.

Samantha's grandmother Jimmie Lee Haskett died of cancer when Samantha was seven years old. That same year, she made her first contribution to Locks of Love.

"That's how much she meant to her (Amanda)," said Donna Haskett, Amanda's mother.

Monday night was her third time donat-

ing hair but her first public haircut. "Anybody of any age can make a difference," said Andrea Whitesides, an American

Cancer Society representative. Whitesides admired Samantha's hair and joked she would like to have it.

Samantha will not be able to find out who received her hair. Her mother speculated that the locks would be combined with other hair to make a complete wig.

Samantha was not able to have her hair permed or color treated in order to meet Locks of Love requirements.

"She was growing it out for somebody else," Donna Haskett said.


