Outdoor safety program at park

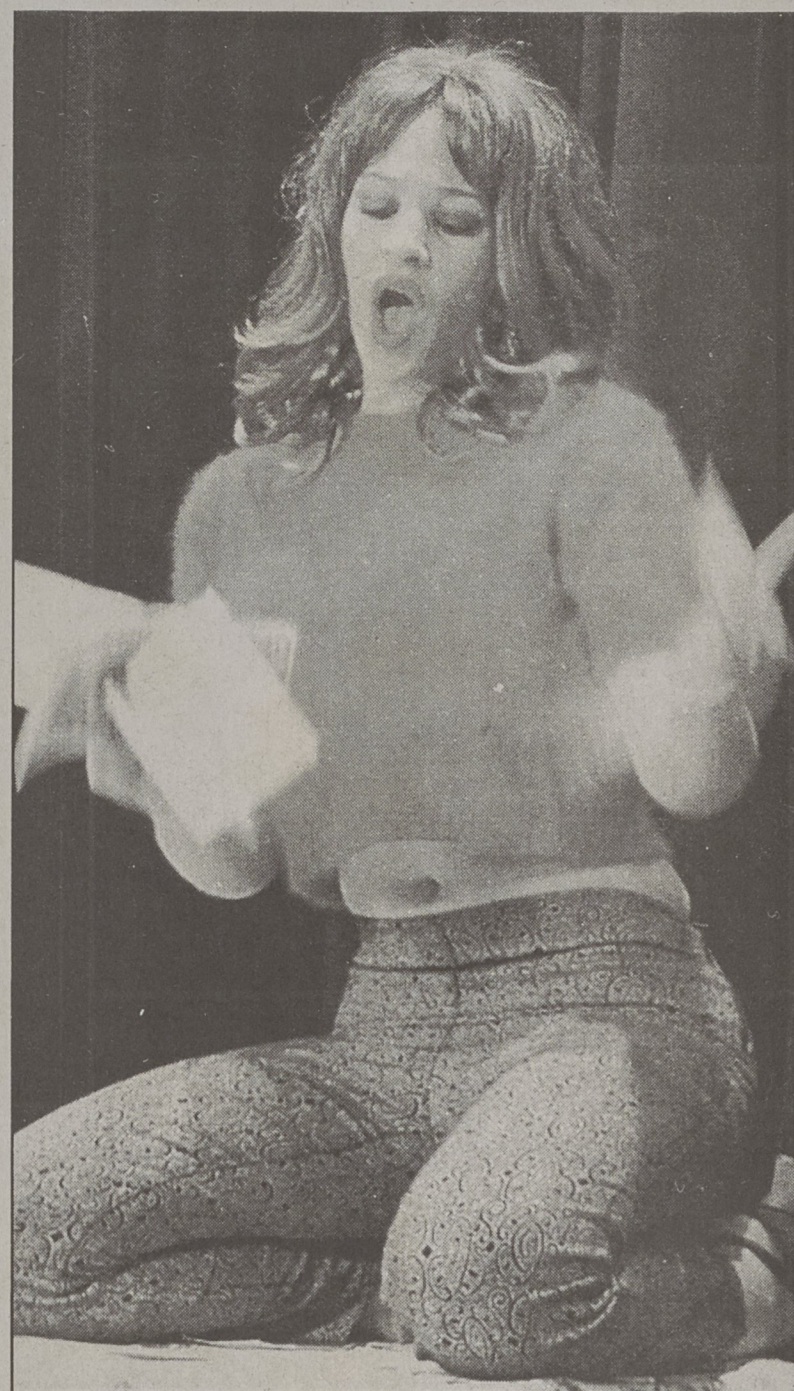
An outdoor safety program will be held Saturday, Feb. 28 at 11 a.m. at Crowders Mountain State Park.
