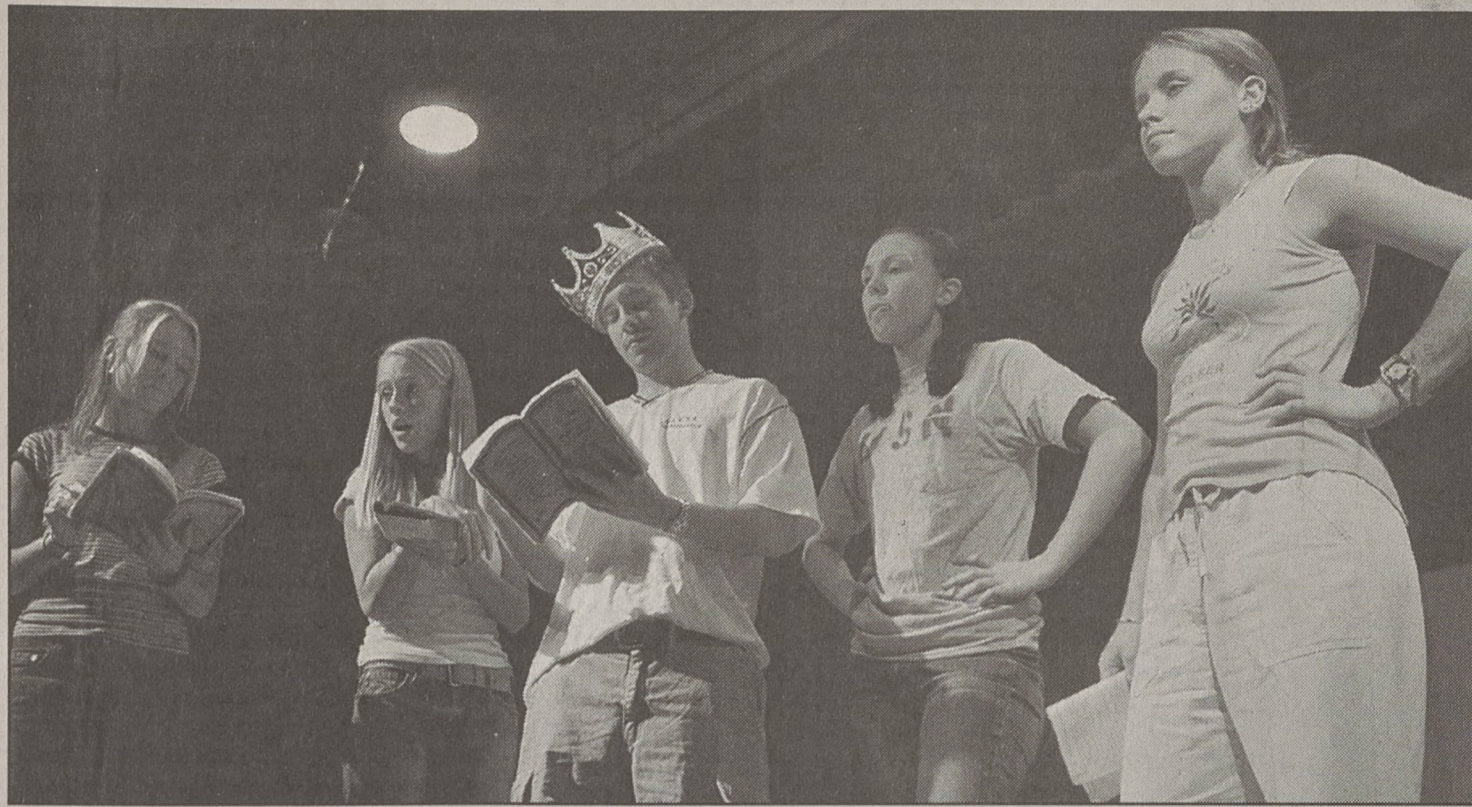

Quack Attack duckpin champ

Quack Attack defeated Jomaz 2-0 Tuesday night at Dilling Heating to win the mixed duckpin bowling league championship roll-off.

Senior play this weekend at Kings Mountain High

A seven-member cast of Kings Mountain High School seniors will bring to life the comedy spoof "The Complete Works of William Shakespeare Abridged" this weekend. "I've seen it a couple times (before). It's always interested me," said theater instructor and director Daniel Treharne. "I'm a huge Shakespeare fan."

The play combines all 16 of the barb's comedies, according to Treharne. The history of Britain is compared to a football game complete with a crown being tossed about like a pigskin.

Set on a bare stage, props and costumes are the only visual aides.

Since practice began four weeks ago, the cast has dwindled from 13 to seven.

"They would all take up the slack, saying what do we need to do to make

the play work," Treharne said.

With a four-day spring break, the cast and four-member crew have had only three actual weeks of rehearsal time.

The approximate two-hour play starts at 7:30 p.m. on Friday and Saturday and at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday at Barnes Auditorium. Admission is \$4 for adults and \$3 for students with valid identification and senior citizens. Children five and under are admitted free.

filed to run for county commission on Tuesday.

Several other Kings Mountain residents are running.

Republican incumbent Tim Moore, 33, has filed to run for a second term in the 111th State House seat.

"We must continue to work to lower the tax burden so that entrepreneurs can create new business opportunities that will put people to work. We must also continue to make government accountable to the people of North Carolina so that the taxpayers are getting the most for their money," Moore wrote in a press release.

During his first term, Moore was part of a bipartisan group visiting China. Sponsored by the State Department, the group examined why American companies are sending jobs to the Asian nation.

He also served as an interim chair of the House Committee on Child Abuse and Neglect. Moore co-sponsored several bills to reduce taxes including eliminating all inheritance and death taxes, according to his press release.

Republican Jim Testa, 64, of Kings Mountain has filed to run for the 46th State Senate seat. Testa owns Kings Mountain Truck Plaza.

Register of Deeds Bonnie Reece, 58, of Kings Mountain has filed to run

for that position again.

William Plonk, 71, of Kings Mountain has filed for to run for another term on the Cleveland County Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisor board.

Republican Dr. Floyd Wright of Cherryville has filed to run for the newly created House seat which includes the Gaston County portion of the City of Kings Mountain, Waco, Fallston, Polkville, Casar, Belwood, Bessemer City, Dallas, Tryon, Alexis and High Shoals.

A current Gaston County

Commissioner, Wright has served as Dean of Gaston College.

Republican incumbent Debbie Clary, 44, formerly represented the Gaston County portion of Kings Mountain. She has filed to run for again for a seat covering portions of Gaston County.

Interim county Coroner Douglas Tysinger of Fallston has filed to run for that position. He is a 56-year-old Democrat. Republican Robbie Morgan Jr., 40, of Fallston, has filed to run for that position as well.
