"A lot of the money has not been turned in because of the rain," Whitesides said.

Scheduled to finish at 11 a.m. Saturday, officials called the event at 8 a.m. Rain began at 1:45 a.m., according to Whitesides.

'You have to do what's in the best interest of the walkers," she said.

Kings Mountain Mayor Rick Murphrey welcomed a crowed of around 1,000 during Friday night's opening ceremonies.

'We have a lot of good volunteers in Kings Mountain," Murphrey said.

"Overall it went very, very good," Whitesides said. "The prettiest thing was the luminary service with 'hope' spelled out on the hill.

The luminaries are purchased in memory and honor of people dealing with cancer.

Teams representing churches, businesses, families, friends and the City of Kings Mountain set up tents and campers, sold food and sponsored fundraising activities while bands played on
