Stephen and Amy Sutton applied last month for the permit which would allow them to have horses and cattle at their 108 Chestnut Ridge Road home. Board members continued the hearing to June, requesting additional information from the Suttons.

Planning Director Steve Killian told board members that the Suttons had specified location options for the barn and had agreed to drop the number of cattle from 15 to eight.

Neighbor Iim Claffe of 1315 Piedmont Avenue objected to the zoning

"A cow is a machine that produces manure; milk and meat are a by product," he

Claffe told planning board members that he purchased his home 19 years ago from a widow. Two other widows lived in the homes adjacent to his.

"Nineteen years later I live next to a feedlot. I didn't choose to live next to a feedlot," he said.

Claffe said that the Suttons had been good neighbors expect for heeding his request to get rid of their animals.
