Two rabies cases reported in county

Two more cases of rabies have been reported in Cleveland County.

A fox found in Polkville and a skunk captured in Shelby are the 90th and 91st cases in the county since 1998, and the 10th and 11th this year, according to

Cleveland County Health Department director Denese R. Stallings.

Cleveland County Animal Control officers picked up the fox at 108 Jan Drive, Polkville, after it attempted to attack a dog June 18.

During the next six months, people living near where the fox was found should observe domestic animals for unusual behavior, Stallings wrote in a press release. Residents should be

sure all dogs and cats have current rabies vaccination. Animals which are not vaccinated and come into contact with a rabid animal must be euthanized, according to Stallings.

A skunk captured at 2063 McBrayer Springs Road, Shelby, tested positive for the disease. Cleveland County Animal Control

agents were called after the skunk killed several chickens.

Health officials advise people living in the vicinity to observe their animals for any unusual behavior. They should also make sure all cats and dogs rabies vaccinations are current.

Animals running loose are at risk of coming in contact with a rabid animal. If the animal is not vaccinated, it will have to be euthanized.
