Gastonia man dies of heart attack while driving in Kings Mountain

A Gastonia man wrecked his truck in Kings Mountain last week after an apparent fatal heart attack, police say. R.C. Lane crashed his 1991 GMC truck Oct. 13 at around 6:30 p.m. on the U.S. 74 bypass, according to a police report. Kings Mountain Police Captain Jerry Tessner said Lane suffered heart problems. There will not be an autopsy, he said.

**HAROLD GILSTAD**  
PORT ANGELES, WA - Harold A. "Gil" Gilstad died peacefully in his sleep in the early hours of October 9, 2004, in Port Angeles, Washington. He was 91.  
He was preceded in death by his father, Arthur M. Gilstad, his mother, Glyda P. Gilstad, and his sister, Edna Dahl.  
He is survived by his wife, Mary; his sons Harold Jr., Dennis, Claire and Scott; daughters-in-law Barbara, Beverly, and Bonnie; grandchildren Elizabeth, John, Kari, Anders, and Kallie; and great-grandchildren Dennis, Mary, Shannon, Kieran, and Anlon.  
Gil and Mary began their life together in the spring of 1935 near Blackduck, Minnesota. They logged and farmed in the area of Gilstad Lake until just before the outbreak of WW II when they moved to Duluth, Minnesota.  
During the war Gil worked in defense-related jobs with Diamond Caulk Company and Oliver Iron Mining Company, both of Duluth. Following the war, the family moved to Milwaukee, Wisconsin where Gil worked for Allis Chalmers Company as a draftsman/designer for ten years. The family then moved to Kings Mountain, North Carolina where Gil worked in engineering design for Lithium Corporation of America in Bessemer City, North Carolina until his retirement in 1978.  
Following his retirement, Gil and Mary traveled extensively visiting their children. Destinations included both U.S. coasts, Alaska, the Caribbean, Japan, and England. They have spent the past seventeen years in Port Angeles, Washington.  
A particularly meaningful moment of Gil's life was his recognition as an Eagle Scout in 1932. He lived his life according to the high ideals expressed by this award. In her 90th year, after 69 years of marriage, Mary still refers to him as "my Eagle Scout." Gil's passing is a keen loss to those who knew him.  
Ceremonies will be private according to Gil's wishes. Any contributions should be made to the charity of the donor's choice.

Fraley quickly explained that the Koran forbids women and children from serving as soldiers. Islam is often misunderstood, according to Fraley. "People think they worship some character named Allah. That's just their word

for God," she said. Fraley is bothered when people assume all Arabs or Moslems are violent. "You can't base a whole race, religion or culture on a handful of people," she said. "Don't always expect the bad just because they believe a certain way. What's right for me may not be right for you." In the past, Fraley says

people often erroneously assumed her Arabic companion assaulted her and forced her to walk three steps behind him and wear a veil. "I was treated like a queen," she said. One difference in Middle Eastern and Western culture is democracy. Most countries in that region have historically been ruled by monarchs. Voting is so new in Afghanistan that there are no booths. Elections officials are having to use tables, according to Fraley. "That's not what they've been taught all their life," she said. Fraley is on medical leave after treatment for cervical cancer. "I let it (pap smear) slip through the cracks," she said. Fraley urges all women to make medical screenings a priority. If there is no recurrence, Fraley will return to duty in

February. She's eager to relieve her fellow soldiers. "Those guys want to come home," she said. "Some of them have children they've never seen. They've done their duty." Fraley has two children. Her parents are Bobby and Judy Green. Contact Andie Brymer at abrymer@kingsmountainherald.com

Despite all the good work, Mid-Atlantic has been criticized for only working with Danes and Dane mixes which look like Danes. "I have to do what I can do without my heartbreaking. My heart breaks anyway. I've carved out a niche."  
Moser admits she has probably burned out Gaston County volunteers and saturated adoptive homes there. "I would love to get more people involved in this area."
