Abell then brought out Raggedy Man, a wooden, doll-like percussion instrument. He made the wooden man perform buck, square and break dances and the moon walk

Morgan Patrick was invited on stage to play the instrument as Abell led the group in a seated square dance. He had the children clapping their hands, snapping their fingers, clicking their tongues and tapping their feet.

Putting down instruments, Abell told the folk story of the little girl who cried diamonds. Initially the tears were a blessing. However, the girl was kidnapped by a greedy man who sold the stones. In the end, a clown rescued her. She laughed till she cried real salt and water tears. The girl never cried diamonds again.


Avery is a senior in the Early Childhood Education program and was nominated by her instructors, Janet Flemming and Lori Sutherland.
