## Women in Revolution program at KMNMP

"I desire that you would remember the Ladies," advised Abigail Adams to her husband John in the Continental Congress.

Women were involved with all aspects of the Revolution, assisting both sides. Those women's voices will be heard at Kings Mountain National Military Park Saturday, March 5 in honor of Women's History Month.

The event is open from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. and admission is free.

Several women were at the Battle of Kings Mountain and one lost her life during the heated engagement. Mary Patton of Tennessee made the gun powder used by a large portion of the patriot contingent.

British Major Patrick Ferguson had two female servants with him. Several wives, mothers, and daughters came to the battlefield in the aftermath to search for relatives and nurse the wounded.

Across the Carolinas, many women played vital roles during the conflict. Some served as spies, others actively fought, and

many remained at home, raising their families, managing businesses, and running their households.

Re-enactors will demonstrate the various skills needed by women to survive on the Carolina frontier. In addition to the militia camp with soldiers discussing and demonstrating weapons, visitors can observe cooking, soap making and sewing.

At 1 p.m. the group Common Knowledge will present a program on skills such as spinning and weaving, clothing and sewing, food preparation, and more. The group has appeared throughout the southeast and is recognized as an authority on Colonial women's skills.

Historian Kay Moss of Gastonia's Schiele Museum will present a program on herbal medicine at 3 p.m. Moss is the author of five books on Colonial life and folk medicine. Her presentation combines facts with sights, smells, tastes, and sounds of the past. Following her program will be a book signing.
