M man faces felony sex charge

A Kings Mountain man has been charged with three felony offenses against a child.

Nathan Daniel McKinnish, 23, of 202-A Blanton Street was arrested Tuesday, July 19.

McKinnish was charged with first degree kidnapping, first degree sex offense against a child and indecent liberties with a child. He was jailed in Cleveland County under a \$150,000 bond.

The kidnapping charge came after McKinnish allegedly restrained the child while allegedly committing the other two felonies. The District Attorney's office is using the charge more often in cases involving children, according to Police Chief Melvin Proctor.

The alleged incident occurred in August, 2004 when the child was eight years old. It was reported in May. According to Proctor, this time frame is not uncommon in cases involving children

McKinnish is not related to the child but was known to the family.
