Everything works out in the end, thanks to the twists and turns of the hilarious, fast-paced book which takes the audience from Times Square to Havana to the sewers of Manhattan, with a bright, brassy immortal score that's also easy to sing.

The "Glass Menagerie" is a memory play drawn from the recollections of narrator Tom Wingfield. The play is set in St. Louis in 1937. Wingfield is an aspiring poet who toils in a shoe ware-

house to support his mother Amanda

and sister Laura.

Tom and Laura's father ran off years ago and except for one postcard, has not been heard from since. Amanda, from a genteel Southern family, regales her children with tales of her idyllic youth and the scores of suitors who once pursued her. She is disappointed that Laura, who wears a brace on her leg and is painfully shy, does not attract any gentlemen callers.

Amanda enrolls Laura in a business college hoping that she will make the family's fortune. Weeks later Amanda discovers that Laura's crippling shyness has led her to drop out of school and spend her days wandering the city alone. Amanda then decides that Laura's last hope must lie in marriage and begins selling newspaper subscriptions to earn the extra money she believes will help to attract suitors for


