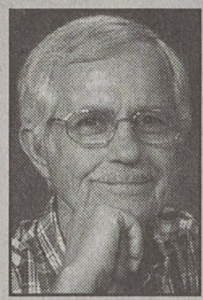


## OBITUARIES

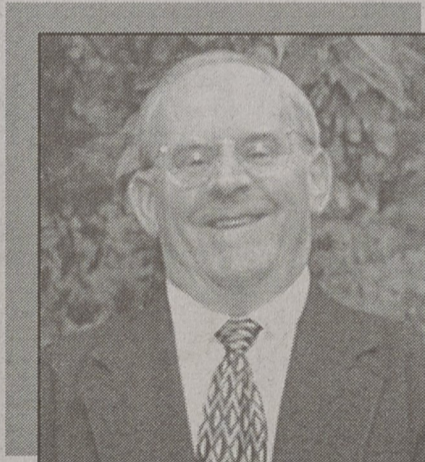
