Gastonia Mayor Jennie Stultz, Keep America Beautiful Affiliates Coordinator, will present city officials with an official certificate as a Keep Kings Mountain Beautiful City Tuesday at the 7 p.m. meeting of city council.

"This has been a long time coming but we are just beginning our community-

wide campaign on beautification," said Sandra Murphrey, co-chair with Mary Anne Hendricks of the project. Murphrey said the city has completed a number of steps to earn this designation and that citizens will be encouraged to volunteer on a number of committees, including recycling, safety, littering, clean-up, etc.

Members of the project executive board also include Brenda Lovelace and Ellis Noell, the city's special events coordinator.

Also at Tuesday's meeting council will hold a public hearing for a proposal for a Farmer's Market to be located for 10 hours (Friday morning and Saturday) in the Fulton's back parking lot downtown. The request is being made by the City of Kings Mountain and Mountaineer Partnership, Inc. Planning Director Steve Killian said the market will be limited to typical garden vegetables, produce, and baked goods, no flea market

items. He said if the council approves the text amendment to allow the market that farmers wishing to sell items to the public should contact his office at city hall for more information. Killian said that a market is identified in the city's existing land development plan.

In a related zoning item, city council may set a public hearing on "uses in Neighborhood Business, General Business and Central Business Districts" as zoning relates to public and private clubs, night clubs, dance halls, flea markets, go kart tracks, etc.


