Bridges introduced Flo Davies, who gave a program on Hummingbirds.


Timely tips were given by Betty Alexander.

single-family units and owner-occupied.

Also at Tuesday's meeting council will hold a public hearing for a proposal for a Farmer's Market to be located for 10 hours (Friday morning and Saturday) in the Fulton's back parking lot downtown. The request is being made by the City of Kings Mountain and Mountaineer Partnership, Inc. Planning Director Steve Killian said the market will be limited to typical garden vegetables, produce, and baked goods, no flea market
