Kings Mountain placed 49 runs batted in. seven players on the All-Southwestern 2A/3A Conference softball team.

In addition, pitcher Morgan Childers was selected SWC Player of the Year and Suzanne Grayson was named Coach of the Year.

Joining Childers on the All-SWC team were catcher Kala Buchanan, first baseman Brittney Thornburg, shortstop Casey Camp, outfielder LaRonda McClain, designated hitter Courtney Tate, and third baseman Kristyn Funderburke.

The seven all-conference standouts and their teammates won their second straight state championship and fifth straight conference

Childers posted a 27-1 record with 413 strikeouts in 184 innings of work. She pitched nine no-hitters, including five perfect games. She pitched all 37 innings in the state tournament, fanning 58 batters.
