Kings Mountain High's men's soccer team opened its regular season Monday night at John Gamble Stadium with a 3-0 win over Hunter Huss.

Chris Miller gave the Mountaineers an early lead with a header. He was assisted by Brandon Mitchell, who had thrown the ball into play.

Tony Chanthaphaeng scored later in the first half off a free kick from 30 yards out. Chanthaphaeng placed the ball in the upper 90 and the Huss keeper couldn't get to it.

Chanthaphaeng scored again in the second half off a

free kick from 25 yards out, again putting the ball in the upper part of the near post out of the keeper's reach.

Kings Mountain had 24 shots on goal. Brandon Mitchell had a couple of good looks but came up short, and Chris Greene had a few shots on goal.

Townsend Haynes played a great game at goal to record the shutout.

Other outstanding offensive players were Daniel Bearden and Chris Potts. Jaye Jackson came off the bench and played a good game in the mid field. Other outstanding defen-

sive players were Chris Skibo, Paul Mansfield, Andrew Turner and Ben Galloway.

"They all gave us solid defense," said Coach Erik Price. "We needed it because Huss kept the pressure on us until the very end."

The Mountaineers hoped to keep the momentum going in a home game against Crest Wednesday.

"We came together as a team tonight," Price said. "And that is what we have been looking for. That is what led to their success out there tonight."

first period when he went back to pass on the KM seven yard line, couldn't find a receiver and scrambled around right end for a touchdown. He was slightly shaken up on the play and back-up quarterback Quintin Coleman and threw a two-point conversion pass to Trent Cathcart.

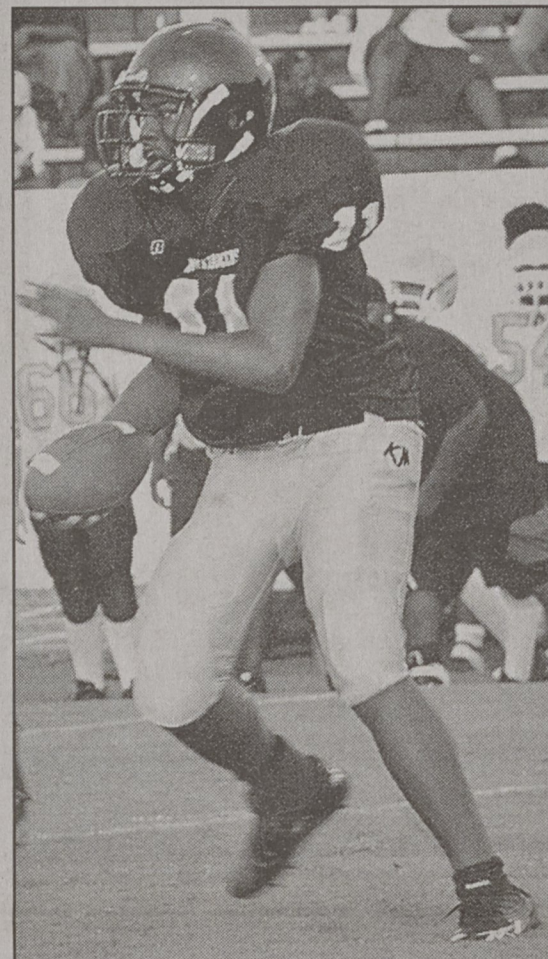
Later, Kings Mountain was backed up on its own one yard line following a Huss punt. A hand off in the backfield was mishandled. After a mad scramble, a KM player fell on the ball, giving Huss a safety and a 10-0 lead.

Huss fumbled the free kick and KM recovered at the Huskies' 39, but moments later the Mounties fumbled the ball back to Huss, and Williams threw a 47-yard touchdown pass to Jawan Williams for a 16-0 halftime lead.

Kings Mountain's defense held the Huskies in check in the second half until the final minute of play, when Williams broke loose on a keeper for a 45 yard touchdown run.

Kings Mountain's only scoring opportunity came in just moments before when Terrance Young returned a punt to the Huss 11. Numerous penalties and a bad snap over the quarterback's head eventually pushed the Mounties back to the 46 where they lost the ball on downs.
