Papa John's Pizza, R.O.'s Barbeque, and Fat & Sassy Concessions will be selling food and drinks. Fox Distributing of Shelby will have a Beer Garden set up at the event. After 5, LIVE! is free and open to the public.

Anthony said that After 5, LIVE! provides a great chance for people to come out after work and just relax, enjoy the music, the food, the atmosphere, and get to know the community a little better. "The whole reason why we are doing this is to encourage more people in Kings Mountain to come downtown and to draw people in to revitalize the downtown area," she said.

"I hope that it will give people something to look forward to in the summer months each year and for people to come downtown and see folks that they don't normally run into on a day-to-day basis," Anthony said.

"We want to have more fellowship with the community and for every one to see what downtown has to offer."


