# KMNMP tour is Sunday

Kings Mountain National Military Park will host an in-depth tour Sunday, Nov. 19 from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Participants will receive a guided tour of the new museum exhibits, followed by a detailed battlefield tour.

The tour will examine the old roads used by both armies, as well as the river crossing at the

Cherokee Ford of the Broad River. On the battlefield itself the group will follow in the footsteps of the attacking Americans and defending Loyalists, with an emphasis on recent archaeology and historical research.

Interested persons should meet at the visitor center at 9 a.m. There will be a short drive

to sites outside the park; the group will carpool as much as possible. The tour will stop for lunch at a nearby restaurant (dutch treat).

Participants will be outside most of the day walking on uneven ground, therefore good shoes, appropriate clothing and bottled water are recommended.

The tour will be strenuous; expect to walk several miles during the course of the day. The program will be cancelled in the event of rain.

BC/KM Highway to W. Pennsylvania, right on S. 12th St., left on W. Alabama Ave. to Edgewood Rd., right on 74 W/Franklin Blvd., right on 74 Business/KM exit to E. King St., and left on Phifer Rd. back to Murphey's Scooter Shed.

From Shelby, take 74 east, turn right on Bethlehem Rd. Go five

From Gastonia: Take 74 Business through Kings Mountain. Pass KM Hospital and turn left at the light onto Phifer Rd. Go three miles (past KM High and KM Middle schools). Camelot Court is on the right.
