NC 216. The pick-up failed to yield the right-of-way to oncoming traffic and the van struck the pick-up."

The truck was driven by a 17-year-old Bessemer City girl. Her name will not be released until she has been charged.

The van was carrying residents of Summit Place Assisted Living. They were on their way home from a day of picking strawber-

ries at Killdeer Farms and shopping for Mother's Day flowers when the accident occurred. Maesue McGill, 84, Mabel Carpenter, 89, Janice Jernigan, 65, Hazel Webster, 75, and Ware were all riding in the van, driven by Judy Lee, 56. Both drivers and all of the passengers were transported to nearby hospitals. Five were sent to Cleveland Regional Medical Center, Ware was sent to Gaston and later to Carolinas Medical Center and the girl was airlifted to CMC, Waters said.
