Kings Mountain native Tony Leigh has been named assistant football coach at Kings Mountain High School, head coach Greg Lloyd announced today.



Leigh, who assisted Lloyd the past two years at East Gaston,

will help defensive coordinator Bill Smothers install KM's new defensive scheme. He will continue to teach at East Gaston until the end of the year, when he plans to retire from teaching. Leigh was an assistant coach at KMHS for several years under Denny Hicks and Ron Massey. He also served tenures as head coach of the girls softball and basketball teams, as well as baseball.

Leigh is a former baseball standout at KMHS and Gardner-Webb University. He began his coaching career in South Carolina. He served as a football assistant coach and head coach at Bessemer City, and as well as an assistant at Canton Pisgah before coming to KMHS in 1986. While at Canton, where Leigh was defensive coordinator in football, he turned out numerous championship softball teams, including one that played for the state 2A championship.

YMCA swimming pool open

The swimming pool at the Kings Mountain Family YMCA is now open daily. Hours are Monday-Friday: 12 p.m.-2 p.m. YMCA members and Summer Camp; 2-5 p.m. YMCA members and general public; Saturday: 11 a.m.-5 p.m. YMCA members and general public; and Sunday 2-5 p.m. YMCA members and general public. The fee is \$3 per person for non-YMCA member. Pool rules include: no inflatable items like inner tubes or water wings due to safety; no cotton clothing such as T-shirts, and no food or drink.

As a new feature this year, starting on Thursday, June 21, the Kings Mountain Family YMCA pool will be open from 7:30 p.m.-9:30 p.m. on Thursday evenings for family swim time. During this time, only families will be allowed into the swimming pool. An adult must accompany anyone under the age of 18. The family swim time will be free for members and \$2 per person for non-members. Registration is underway for swim lessons for ages 6 months and up. Prices are \$15 for YMCA members, \$31 for non-members residing within the city limits of

Kings Mountain, and \$45 for non-residents. Register by June 28 for classes to be held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings July 2-July 19, or register by July 19 for classes to be held Monday and Wednesday mornings or Tuesday and Thursday evenings July 23-August 9. The pool is also available for party rentals. For prices and availability call the YMCA at 704-739-9631. On July 4th the swimming pool will be open from 6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. Pizza, chips, drinks, ice cream and candy concessions will be sold during this time. All guests are required to leave the pool prior to the start of fireworks for safety reasons.

Bowen stationed at Barksdale AFB

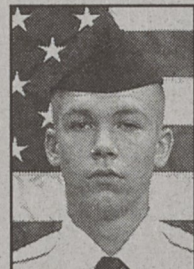
