

Getting "more bang for your buck" this 4th of July can result in a misdemeanor score on your criminal record if the fireworks aren't North Carolina-approved.

Here are a few tips to keep you safe and on the right side of the law this holiday. State laws mandate that any explosive fire-works or any that leave the ground, like roman candles and rockets, are not allowed for sale or use in North Carolina. 


