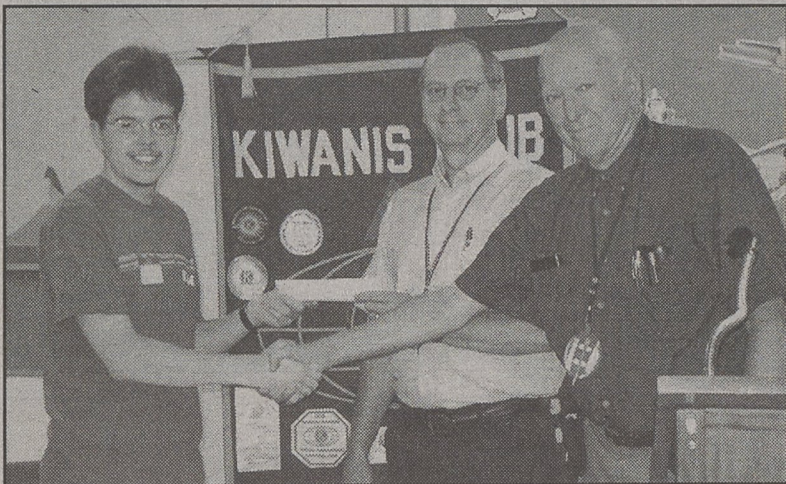
Haley Selene Peeler will attend Appalachian State University in Boone, next year. She plans to major in English and minor in History. A 2008

Mauney Memorial Library needs your old books, movies and audio books. If not

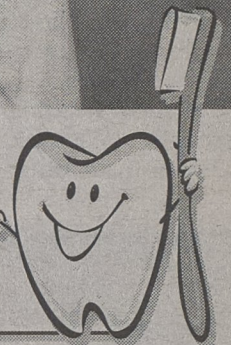
entered into the library's collection, donated materials will be sold in Mauney's Book Nook area. The sale of these items will help the library purchase new books, movies and audio books.
