
#### RACHAEL FARLEY

### **Drought assistance** granted to farms in **Cleveland County**

U.S. Congressman Patrick McHenry recently announced that three counties in the 10th District have qualified for federal loan assistance stemming from the drought and excessive heat experienced in 2008.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has determined that there were sufficient agriculture production losses to warrant a disaster designation. This designation makes farm operators in Cleveland County and parts of Gaston and Rutherford Counties eligible to be considered for low-interest emergency loans from USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA).
