McGinnis, Hardee, Adam Brock and Tanner Deaton finished third in the 400 yard free relay.

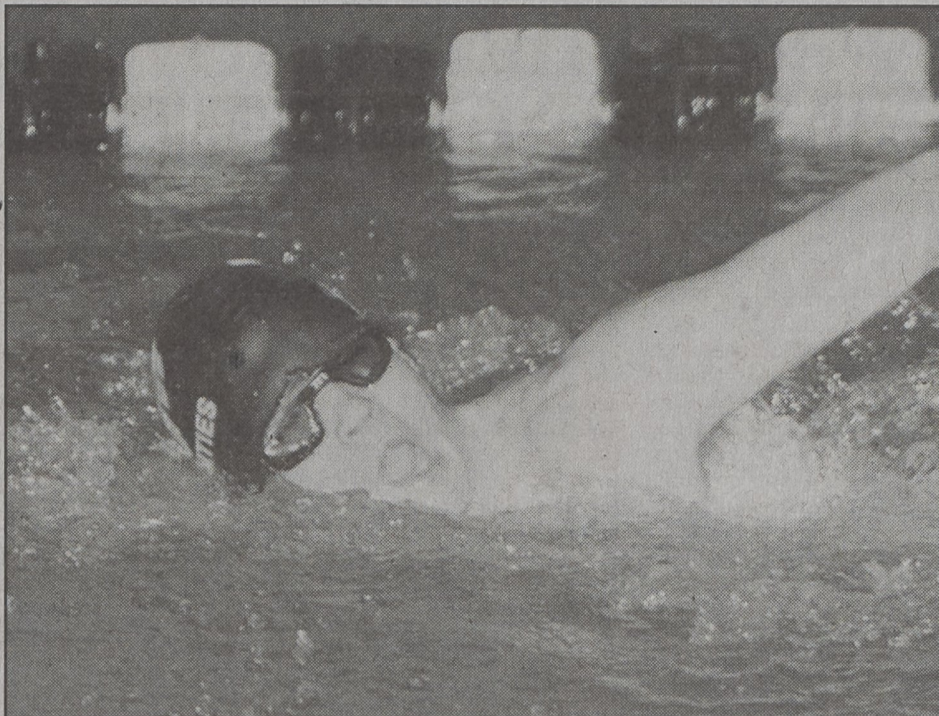
Gladden, Tate, McGinnis and Sellers were third in the 200 yard medley relay.

Sarah Greenlee won the only conference championship for the Kings Mountain women.

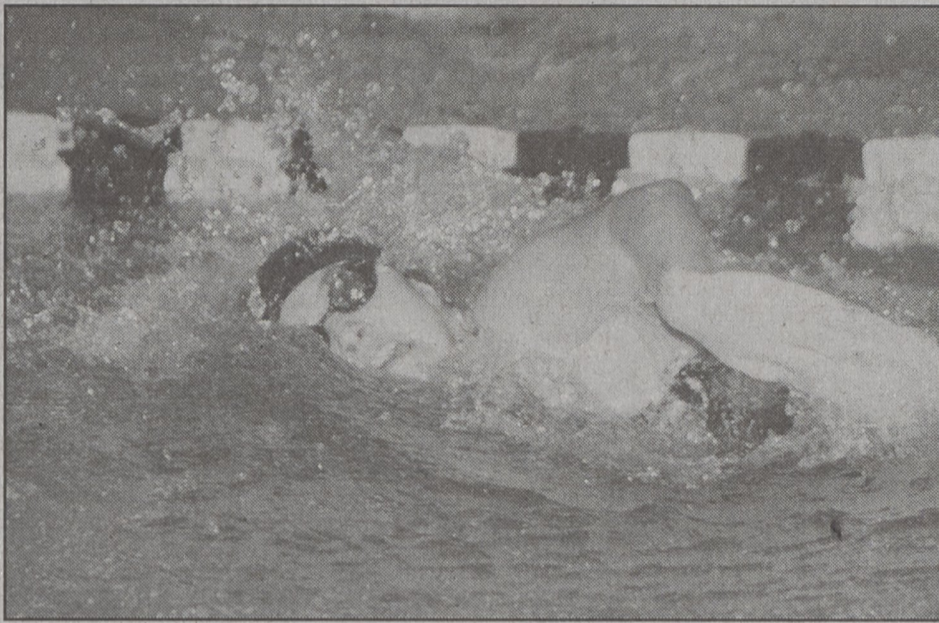

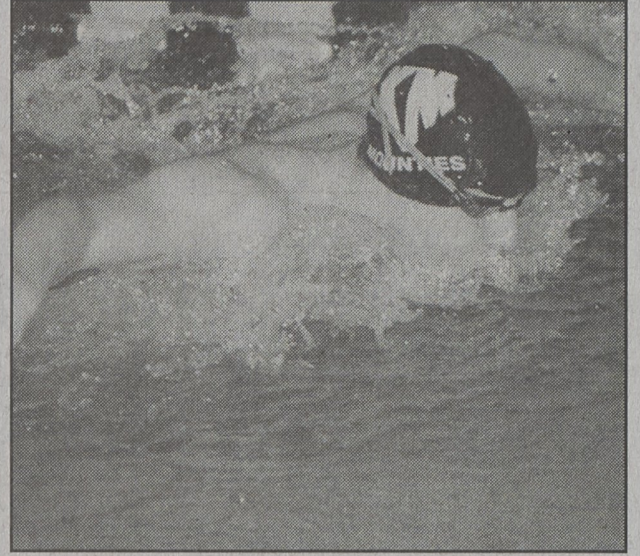

A public hearing will be conducted on February 24, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. by the City of Kings Mountain concerning the closeout of a CDBG Grant (Grant #07-E-1642). The purpose of this grant was to provide public sewer access to Ingles Supermarket. In return the company committed to the creation of at least 14 new jobs with at least 60% of those jobs going to low and moderate income persons. The company has met this commitment. The total project cost was estimated to be \$131,600 with 100% of this funding coming from the Community Development Block Grant program. The actual cost of the sewer line and related project administration was approximately \$80,000 with 100% of this from a CDBG grant. No local funds were expended for this project.

The hearing will be conducted in the Council Chambers at the Kings Mountain City Hall located at 101 West Gold Street. All citizens of the Community are invited to attend.

Notice of Close Out Public Hearing

The Kings Mountain City Council will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, February 24, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. in the Kings Mountain City Hall, 101 W. Gold St., Kings Mountain NC. The purpose of this hearing is to receive citizen comments about the close out of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) project #06-C-1596 received by the City from the North Carolina Division of Community Assistance (DCA).

The City received \$440,000 in CDBG funds to install 6,400 linear feet of public sewer lines and connect 31 single family homes to the new line in the Westover neighborhood. This project is completed. These funds are provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
