# King to chair district GOP

Over 190 Republican delegates representing all 10 counties in North Carolina's Tenth Congressional District gathered at the Little Theater in Cherryville Saturday to elect officers to lead the District Party for the next two years.

Delegates unanimously elected former Cleveland County GOP Chairman Wayne King, of Kings Mountain, to serve as District Chairman. King follows former Mitchell County Commissioner Bill Slagle as chairman of the Party. Slagle did not seek reelection and supported King.

"I am extremely honored to be elected and look forward to working (with) my fellow officers and party activists in the district. The 10th has traditionally been one of the most Republican districts in the Southeast and we're going to work hard to make sure it stays that way," said King.

"Our district has an excellent standard-bearer in Congressman Patrick McHenry and this party stands solidly behind him as he fights for our conservative values in Washington."

McHenry attended the convention as a delegate from Gaston County and addressed those assembled.

"Wayne was a great Party Chairman in Cleveland County and I have every confidence he will take our party to a new level," McHenry said.

King recognized the contributions that every county's GOP has made to the district's success in the past but paid particular tribute to delegates from Catawba County. It has been a tumultuous month for Catawba Republicans.

The State Republican Party ruled the Party as unorganized after previous party leaders violated the NCGOP's rules for organizing their county GOP convention. The NCGOP stepped in to organize new precinct meetings and a new convention after over 150 duly-elected delegates were



turned away from the original convention.

"I want to be very clear about the situation in Catawba County," King said. "I am very happy to have a new slate of officers who want to work in a cooperative spirit with the rest of the district rather than focus on infighting which has been the unfortunate case in the past few years. Catawba Chairman Bill Shillito and his team are a first-class group and I look forward to the great things they are going to do in our District's largest county."

King began his political activism as a teen when he managed State Senator Debbie Clary's campaigns during her days in the State House. Since then he has worked on numerous campaigns and was elected a delegate to the 2004 and 2008 Republican National Conventions.

King and his wife Pam are residents of Kings Mountain. They have a daughter, Courtney and a son, Noah.
