Erica Hicks qualifies for 4th straight regional

Kings Mountain High senior golfer Erica Hicks qualified for her fourth straight Western Regional Tournament after finishing third in the Big South 3A Conference with a 45.5 average over six conference matches.

Hicks shot a 42 to tie for second in the final BSC match Monday at Green Meadows Golf Course in Mount Holly. By finishing in the top ten over the course of the season, Hicks earned a spot on the All-Big South Conference team.

Paige Donaldson of South Point won Monday's match with a 38. South Point's Katie Barnette led all BSC golfers for the season with an average of 41.7 and earned conference golfer of the year honors.

South Point won Monday's match with a team score of 127, followed by Forestview 152, North Gaston 159, Ashbrook 160, KM 160 and Crest 169.



Erica Hicks finished third overall in the Big South Conference golf matches this year to earn All-Conference honors and qualify for next week's Western Regional Tournament in Asheville.

For the year, South Point finished first with a 934, followed by Forestview 1,071, KM 1,126, North Gaston 1,168, Ashbrook 1,185 and Crest 1,233.

The Western Regional tournament will be played Monday at Asheville Municipal. The top finishers there will advance to the state tournament.

"Black Monday," a black brindled Plott Hound was the first known to have won Best of the Breed at the Westminster Dog Show. He has since

Some people think that one of the early European predecessors of the Plott Hound could be the Hanoverian Schweisshund, Libby said.

Asking the students if they had ever seen their birth certificates, she showed them a Plott Hound's – unrolling a nearly three-foot long poster of the pedigree (six generations).

After sharing information about the breed and how Plott Hounds became a state symbol, she asked the students if they were ready to meet "Lucky". The children cheered and yelled his name.
