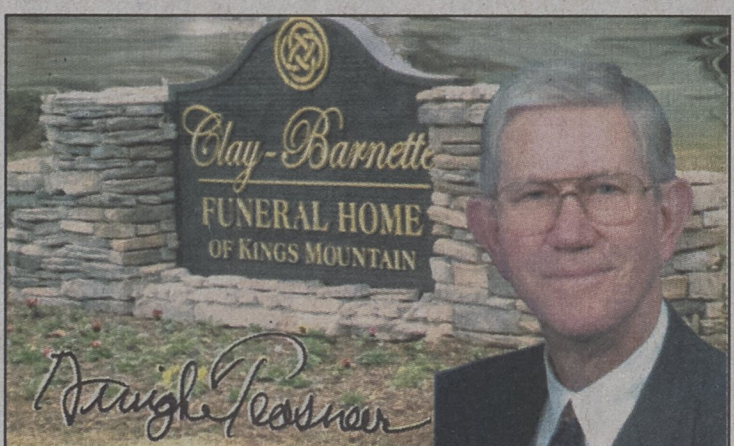
Car Fit at Senior Center May 20
