ABC sets hearing on board's \$1.2M budget

A public hearing on the Kings Mountain ABC Board's consider adopting the proposed budget. proposed \$1,254,200 budget for 2012-2013 will be conducted June 26 at 5:30 p.m. at the ABC Store, 220 Cleveland

After the public meeting, the board will meet at 6 p.m. to Kings Mountain ABC Store, 220 Cleveland Avenue.

The proposed budget was submitted to the ABC Board on May 22, 2012. A copy is available for inspection in the office of the board's general manager Aileen Ormand at the

The proposed budget includes a modest increase in total revenue from 2011-2012, said Ormand.

City sets hearing on \$34.5M budget

A public hearing on the city's \$34.5 million budget will be conduced by Kings Mountain City Council Thursday, June 14, at 6 p.m. in the Council Chambers of city hall.

After the public hearing, to which the city invites input, the board will vote on its adop-

City Manager Marilyn Sellers is proposing no property tax increase and no increase in service fees to Kings Mountain citizens in the 2012-2013 budget. The budget proposes a 2% cost of living increase to the 180 full time city employees and continued health and retirement benefits for employees and earmarks funds for three pilot programs and for capital outlay improvements.

The proposed budget is decreased by \$211,000 from 2011-2012.

Kings Mountain City Council set the date for the public hearing at its May 29 meeting.

GROVER Water, sewer rates

could rise in Grover

GROVER - Residents will see no increase in taxes but in some service fees in the proposed \$652,845 budget presented to city council Monday night.

Next year's proposed budget keeps the tax rate at 29 cents per \$100 valuation plus 38 cents for debt retirement for construction loans and necessary operational expenses for the Grover Municipal Sewer System. Combined, the rate is 67 cents per \$100 assessed valuation.

The budget proposes a 3% increase for water rates and 3% increase to customers for sewer. Mayor J. D. Ledford told the board in recent budget workshops and during the budget presentation that the increase is necessary to mitigate costs.

Grover residents will also see a \$2 per month increase for trash pickup. Ledford said the fee increase is necessary because the town is losing \$11,000 annually to provide

The proposed budget provides seven city

employees a 3% cost of living raise. The proposed budget is open for inspection for 10 days at city hall.

The council set June 25 at 6 p.m. for a vote on the budget.

The proposed budget includes \$297,697 for the general fund, \$3,900 for the cemetery fund, \$22,200 for the Powell fund and \$328,950 for the water and sewer fund.

In other actions, the board purchased two radios, a shotgun and rifle for the police department, amended the 2011-2012 budget by increasing Grover Festival revenue and expense by \$19,582 and discussed speed bumps for several areas of town and opening and closing schedules for Grover Park.

The board took no action after a closed session to discuss the sale of real property.


