Although he lost his top two scorers off last year's team which finished 18-9 and went three rounds in the state playoffs, he has the mix of good returning players and talented newcomers to make another run.

The Mountaineers will scrimmage East Lincoln on the road Saturday at 1 p.m. and host Blacksburg, SC in a scrimmage at KM's Parker Gym on Tuesday, Nov. 18 at 6 p.m. before opening the regular season at home on Thursday, Nov. 20 against the South Point Red Raiders.

"We're going to be a deep team," Pierce said. "Hopefully we'll be playing 11 or 12 deep. I feel like we will be as good, if not better than last year."


KM second In fall sports Wells Fargo
