"They're both amazing artists - they can do almost anything," Queen said. "This is all family run, me and my daughters."

At the ribbon-cutting Saturday, Queen served pizza and cupcakes and was already busy taking orders.

"It was a great time and I really loved the turnout," said Queen, a West Virginia native who has recently lived in Myrtle Beach, S.C. "I felt that the city has really welcomed us." Queen has a special treat lined up for the holiday season, too. She'll be serving coffee and hot cocoa for the Kings Mountain Christmas Parade on Dec. 6 and for the downtown Christmas light show that kicks off in the next few weeks.

"I've had a lot of jobs, including a country-western DJ and managing a radio station. I've also worked as a licensed therapist," Queen said. "But art is more a passion for me. I just like to make things pretty.'
