

MINUTES OF THE FOURTEENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE NEW FOUND BAPTIST ASSOCIATION, HELD WITH FINE'S CREEK CHURCH, HAYWOOD COUNTY, N. C., August 6 and 7, 1869.

FINE'S CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH, FRIDAY, AUGUST 6th, 1869. The Sermon Introductory to business was delivered by Eld. John Ammons from Exod. 14: 15. After a recess of thirty minutes the delegates assembled in the meeting-house. The Moderator and Clerk being absent Eld. Jacob R. Wild was called to the chair, and Eld. John Ammons to act as secretary, pending the organization.

SATURDAY MORNING 9 O'CLOCK. Met according to adjournment. Prayer by J. Plemons. The Committee on Arrangement reported and were discharged. Read Rules of Decorum. Resolved To appoint Union Meetings. 1st. At FLAT CREEK—Beginning on Friday before the first Sabbath in November 1869.

The committee on Finance reported twenty-three dollars and fifty-five cents for publishing minutes.
