Mitchell College **Transfer Is** Authorized

At a meeting of Concord Presbytery, held Tuesday afternoon in Marion, authorization was given to the Presbytery's trustees of Mitchell College to transfer all properties and assets of the college to the Mitchell College Foundation, Inc., the transfer to be effective December 31 of this year.




