



Ephesians, the fourth chapter of which is assigned to our lesson. This fourth chapter of Ephesians is so full of gems of wis-dom and advice on Christian liv-ing, that it is impossible to quote much therefrom. It should be earnestly studied by the teacher and the pupils should learn at least some of the passages by heart where they will be remem-

bered in later years. He reminds the Ephesians that as Christians they must put away their former sinful feelings and "be renewed in the spirit of your mind; And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness.

"Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbor; for we are members of one another. Be ye angry and sin not; let not the sun go down upon your wrath.... "Let all bitterness, and wrath

and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice:
