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BASS FISHING

What had been advocated by several local citizens in regard to the surplus number of large mouth bass inhabiting the waters of Lake Mattamuskeet, appears to be taking the form of a possibility.

It is reported that R. Bruce Etheridge, Director of the N. C. State Department of Conservation and Development, is about to open negotiations with the Hecksher interests, owners of the lake property, for the purpose of securing a long time lease on the property. If such a deal is consummated and the lake put under state control and supervision, many fresh streams in North Carolina once plentiful with game fish but now almost barren, could be stocked from the surplus supply found in the lake.

Since the refilling of the lake its waters are literally "working alive" with large mouth bass weighing from one-half to one pound and fishermen have flocked there from all parts of the state and in no time and with little effort caught the limit. These record catches of bass had not been experienced in this section in the past number of years.

About ten or twelve years ago the creels of the Pango and Pauline rivers furnished Belhaven for game fishermen but in recent years even a "rise" is almost unknown.

It is hoped by many here that whether the state or someone else takes the lake in charge that the plan of restocking the fresh rivers and creeks through out North Carolina with these fish can become a reality.
