TELEPHONE CONNECTION TO
ENGELHARD

The citizens of Engelhard are meeting Friday night to consider plans for the installation of a telephone system to link Engelhard with the outside world.

F. P. Latham has made application to the State Utilities Commission for permission to construct and operate toll lines between Swan Quarter, New Holland, Engelhard and other points in Hyde county.

At the present time Engelhard bears the unique reputation of being among the few towns in the east that doesn't have telephone or telegraph facilities within 25 miles. It will be recalled that the Bank at Engelhard was, so far as we can learn, the only bank in the United States that remained open the first day of the President's declaration of a bank holiday due to the lack of communication.

Whether or not the citizens of Engelhard and other communities throughout the county will consider having a private telephone installed in their residence or place of business, the main question should be to get the line extended into the community if they got but one connection and that the whole community with all the citizens assessed for the cost.
