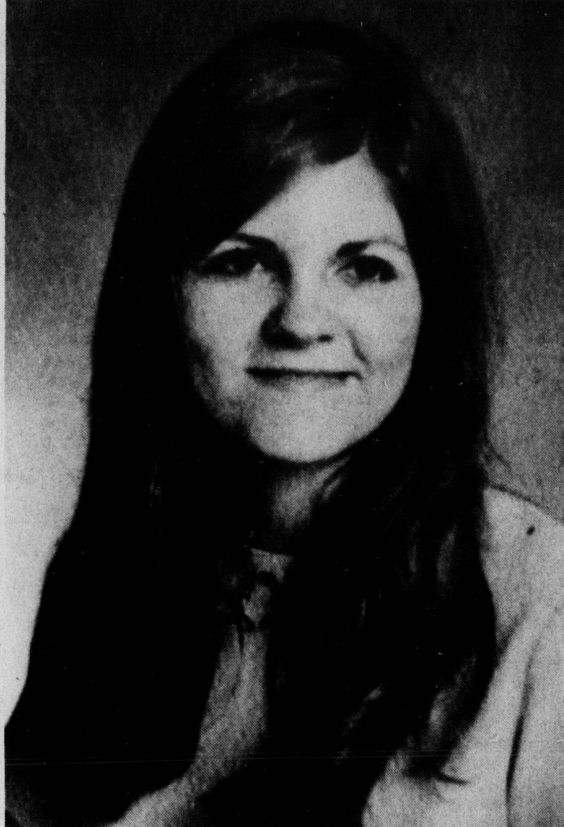

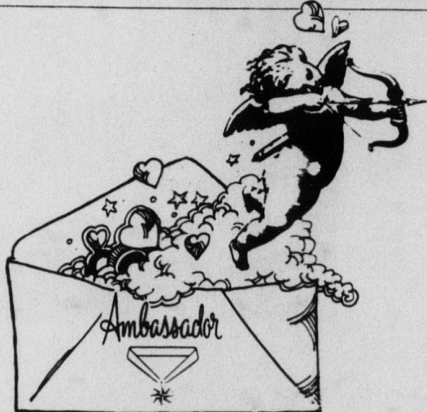

WEEKLY RECIPE

Coca Cola Cake

LOU BALLEW

Cake
1 cup coca cola
2 tbsps. cocoa
2 sticks margarine
2 cups sugar
1/2 cup buttermilk
1 tsp. soda
2 unbeatn eggs
1 tsp. vanilla
2 cups flour
1 1/2 cups small marshmallows
Put coca cola, cocoa and margarine in a 2 1/2 quart sauce pan and bring to boil. Remove from heat and add rest of ingredients. Bake in a greased 13" X 9" pan at 350 degrees for 35 minutes or until done.
ICING (to be poured over hot cake)
1/2 cup coca cola
1 stick margarine

3 tbs. cocoa
1 box powdered sugar
1 cup chopped nuts
In a saucepan bring coca cola, margarine and cocoa to the boil. Add powdered sugar and nuts. Mix well. Pour over hot cake. Store cake in refrigerator - it keeps very well.
