New Fabric Label Will Provide Care Details

RALEIGH -- It's tragic when you make a garment and don't know how to take care of it. Especially if you wash it and it falls apart or you dryclean it and it melts.

Maybe you've wished for a handy sew-in label that will remind you if a fabric is washable or not.

Even if you haven't, such a label is coming next summer, according to Dorothy Barrier, extension clothing specialist, North Carolina State University. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) has ruled that as of July, 1972, all fabrics sold over the counter must have care labels "which consumers can affix permanently to the finished product."

This free label can solve the care problem of the woman who neglects to learn about a fabric before she buys it—or who reads the

fabric bolt information but promptly forgets it when she gets home, Miss Barrier says.

But to make the new ruling effective, you will have to sew the label in the finished garment yourself. Fabric manufacturers and retailers are concerned about this ruling, as it means more expense and problems for them. They say there is no set way for the labels to be distributed to consumers. Appeals to the ruling are in the works. One suggested solution to care problems may be to require a standardized national code stamped on the selvage of all U. S. produced fabrics.

Or, if you'd like labels for the clothing you already have made, you will soon be able to buy a set of 15 care instructions at many fabric shops.

February Garden Work Includes Making Plans

If you have not accomplished your February planning chores, some suggestions may be helpful.

Get your seed orders in. You most likely have in mind many flowers, fruits and vegetables that have done well for you or that you might have observed in the gardens of friends. Stick pretty closely to those varieties which have proven themselves but do not hesitate to try a few new ones.

If you are landscaping a new home, or "sprucing-up" a bit around the established home, check with your local nurseryman or county agent. They will have suggestions about plant materials suitable for all locations in your landscape plan.

If you have a greenhouse, you can expect improvement in growth from now on as the days are getting longer. Over-watering is a common error. There is no rule-of-thumb. One must use good judgment. Plants need more water on a bright day than on a cloudy one. Regulation of the night temperature is important during cold nights. This is especially true if you have tomato plants.

Now is a good time to plant apples, peaches, plums, cherries, pears and grapes. When planting, dig a hole large enough to accommodate the root sys-

tem without crowding. Separate top and subsoil and place the top soil around the roots. After the roots are well covered, pack with your feet to within about four inches of the top of the hole. Finish filling with loose soil. Set the plants as deep as they stood in the nursery row. You can easily identify this soil line at the base of the plant.

Don't overlook the dwarf type fruit plants. They are well suited for areas where space is a problem.

If you have apple, peach and plum trees, prune them and spray with winter (dormant) strength lime sulphur. The same treatment will also be fine for your bunch grape vines and raspberries.

Have your soil tested. If a need for phosphorus, potash and lime is indicated, it is the better plan to work these materials into the first six or eight inches of soil before planting. If applied to the soil surface, these materials do not move to the root area as does nitrogen. Band placement, to the side and below the seed, is all right for shallow rooted crops but will not provide the nutrient balance for those plants which have deeper root systems.

Going to school, boys and girls, may not be a pleasure trip but it will look like one after you buck the world for a living.
