Nancy Roberts' One Week Run For Governor

Nancy Roberts is a nice wo-man who made the mistake of thinking she could run for Governor of North Carolina and have a reasonable chance of winning

Mrs. Roberts found out the hard way and now she's an ex-candidate, at first bitter and cynical, but now calm and matter-of-fact in her recollection of her one week run at the Governor's mansion

After refusing to talk with reporters for more than a week, Mrs. Roberts spoke with me about her experience. "I would not have gotten into the race if I didn't think at the time that I had a reasonable chance of winning,", she said. 'But there were some things about politics that I just didn't

know "I had volunteers from all over the state call me and ask to work in my campaign. But I know now that you need at least a few political pros in your campaign, people who can direct these volunteers. And all of the so-called pros were already lined up with other candidates. It was very frustrating. Here I hadpeople wanting to work but they didn't know what to do and I didn't know what to tell them. It boiled down to a case of too many Indians and not enough chiefs."

There was also the problem of money. Mrs. Roberts, a former newspaperwoman, is

Mrs. Roberts called a press to be very active in his behalf. She says a Pat Taylor campaign aide, Jerry Shinn tried to get her to withdraw from the race. Shinn denies that he tried to get her out of the cam-
