Broyhill Discusses Consumer, **Environmental Legislation**

Congressman James T. Broyhill, speaking Friday to a meeting of the Gastonia Lions Club, discussed new consumer and environmental leg-islation coming from the curislation coming from the cur-rent session of Congress. The government and the Congress have responded to public de-mand for stronger laws in these two areas, the Con-gressman stated, but there is a legitimate concernabout the purpose and effectiveness of new programs.

The Tenth District Representative discussed a recently released government study impact of new anti-pollution regulations on U. S. industry. "We must face the fact," he

stated, "that some disloca tion may occur, but the over-all impact is not really so great as first predicted. For example, it is estimated that 50,000 to 125,000 jobs may be lost as a result of these plant closings. It should be pointed out, on the other side, that the lutants alone in damage to public health, plant life, and buildings is estimated at \$16 billion a year."

Broyhill also stated that "Congress can and should ease the impact of anti-pollution laws on wage earners, businesses, and local commu-nities."

He also discussed the need

for new laws in the field of consumer protection. To il-lustrate his point, Broyhill displayed a number of toys taken from store shelves which presented clear safety haz-ards for children. He said that Federal standards were necessary to protect the public

from such hazardous products. "However," he stressed, "we must work out leg-islation that will be both fair to the consumer and operable in the marketplace. The consumer does not benefit from idealistic legislation which istered properly."
