Cleve Tech, G-W Credit Transfer

An agreement which will allow students of Cleveland County Technical Institute to transfer credits to Gardner-Webb has been announced jointly by the two institutions.

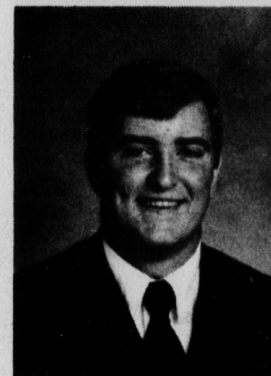
The announcement was made by the heads of the two schools, Dr. E. Eugene Poston of Gardner-Webb and James B. Petty of Cleveland Tech.

"Where there are students who are capable of doing more academically than Cleveland Tech offers then we would encourage them to continue their education at Gardner-Webb," said Mr. Petty. "Many times there are students who do not realize they are capable of doing work beyond what we offer at Cleveland Tech," continued Mr. Petty. "In such cases we are certainly happy to recommend that they continue their work at such a senior college as Gardner-Webb."

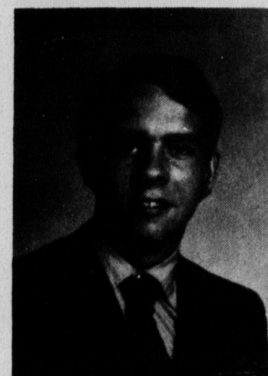
Dr. Poston indicated his enthusiasm over the joint agreement. "We appreciate the deep interest shown by the officials of Cleveland Tech and their desire to provide the best in education for their students," said Dr. Poston. Dr. Poston pointed out that in many cases students may be out of high school for a period of time to fulfill military obligations or the need to work and then attend such schools as Cleveland Tech.

Juniors Eligible For National Science Institute At WCU

Western Carolina University will conduct a 10-week institute this summer for high school juniors with superior ability in math.

Thirty high school students from across the nation will be selected for the institute which will be financed by a grant from the National Science Foundation.

The institute begins June 12 and ends August 18.

To meet the eligibility requirements students will have to meet three requirements: be a high school junior (although highly qualified sophomores will be considered), have at least two years of college preparatory high school mathematics, but no more than three years, and have a grade of "A" in high school mathematics courses including the mathematics course being taken this year.

Application forms may be obtained from Dr. Joseph W. Dodson, Director, Mathematics Summer Institute, Western Carolina University, Cullowhee, North Carolina 28723.

The overall objective of the institute is to provide the opportunity for superior high school mathematics students to consider a variety of mathematical topics from the standpoint of the creative mathematician—an activity which

he may seldom or never participate in as an high school student or as a freshman or sophomore in college.

Top officials from 41 North Carolina school systems will attend management briefings

this summer, conducted by the American Management Association. The training of local school administrators is part of a \$250,000 U.S. Office of Education grant to the State Department of Public Instruction.

The briefings will be held at Sanderson High School in Raleigh July 12-14 and at the Charlotte/Mecklenburg Education Center August 9-11.

Attending the Raleigh briefing will be top officials from school systems in Raleigh, Sanford, Fayetteville, Durham, Salisbury, Person County, Durham County, Orange County, Martin County, Elm City, Onslow County, Edgecombe County, Carteret County, Columbus County, Hoke

Park each week on the same day and hours as the first class day. Courses vary from 30 to 33 hours.

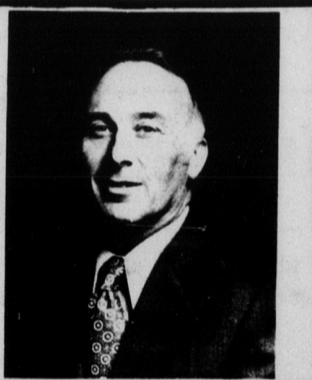
Those interested in any of the latter group of classes should report directly to the City Park on the first class date.
