

Little Theatre Reveals Plans For Improving Park Grace Facility

The Kings Mountain Little Theatre, prior to their first production of the new 1972-1973 season, announces plans for improvement of its current facilities at Park Grace School. Extension of the stage to make more ambitious shows feasible and improvements for the benefit of patrons are being drawn up.

Park Grace was formerly an elementary school but because of its small size and its age became uneconomical for that use and it is now used as the schools maintenance workshop and a storage building. The auditorium was not used and the school board decided to allow the Little Theatre to stage its productions there. The front door, which had been boarded up to form a small office in the entrance hall, has now been opened up so that members of the audience will be able to enter there rather than using a side-door. The theatre hopes to provide indoor rest rooms for the public sometime in the future and with enlargement of the stage and an improved lighting system, the Theatre hopes to embark upon some musical shows within the next year or two.

In order to finance these improvements the Theatre is seeking the support of local citizens especially those who are regular play-goers. The public is being offered several ways in which to support these enthusiastic but amateur thespians. The least expensive way to

support the Theatre is to buy a \$2.00 regular membership. This entitles the holder to attend all general meetings and vote for officers and play directors.

\$5 will purchase a supporting membership that also entitles the holder to three tickets-one for each production. The Theatre schedules three shows per year (one in November, one in February and one in April or May).

\$15 will purchase a sponsorship and a listing in each of the year's three play bills.

\$20 will purchase a sponsor/member which includes a listing in each of the three play bills and three tickets (one per production).

\$25 will purchase a patronage. Patrons will be listed in each of the three play bills and will also receive nine tickets (three per production).

Anyone wishing to purchase any of the above memberships is asked to contact Joe Smith at Kings Mountain Savings and Loan. He will answer any questions. Joe serves on the finance committee of the Theatre together with treasurer, Stan Gainey and board member Hetty Cox. The memberships will also be on sale at Park Grace during the production of "The Panda and the Spy." Inquiries may be made there at the Box Office. Performance dates are November 10, 11, 17, 18 at 7:30 p.m., and Sunday November 19th at 2:30

p.m. "The Panda and the Spy" is being directed by Mrs. Raymond Holmes and has a cast of fourteen students.

The Theatre also announces that its February production will be "Bull in a China Shop"-a mystery that turns out to be a hilarious comedy. Auditions for this play will be held at Park Grace on Monday and Tuesday, November 13th and 14th at 7:30 p.m. There are parts in this play for 7 wo-

men and 5 men and there are roles of various sizes. Any member of the general public is invited to attend auditions-you do not have to be a theatre member in order to try out for a part. 1. Obtain a free MEAL-TIME BINGO saver card on request at the end of the check out or at store office. Obtain one free MEAL-TIME BINGO Game Ticket every time you visit a participating Harris Teeter store. No purchase is required. Adults only eligible to play.
